April 2, 2023 5th Sunday of Great Lent: St. Mary of Egypt

On Sundays in Great Lent, we celebrate the Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great.

This Life of Our Venerable Mother Mary of Egypt was written down in the seventh century by Saint Sophronius, Patriarch of Jerusalem, some hundred years after the repose of the holy Mary, who fell asleep in the Lord April 1, 522. It is one of the most beautiful and edifying lives of a saint. Its obvious and stated purpose is to glorify God and to feed the souls of its readers. St. Sophronius lifts up the life of blessed Mary as a most wondrous example of repentance for all the faithful. Indeed, the Church has for centuries lifted up this life before all the faithful on the Fifth Sunday of the Great Fast, the Sunday before Palm Sunday. It is both a challenge and an inspiration to us. It shows us what a human being is capable of when she works with the all-powerful saving and forgiving grace of our all-loving God.

HYMNS OF THE DAY

Tone 1 – Resurrectional Troparion

When the <u>stone</u> had been sealed by the <u>Jews</u>, while the soldiers were guarding Your most pure <u>bo</u>dy, You <u>rose</u> on the third day, O <u>Sa</u>vior, granting <u>life</u> to the world. The <u>pow</u>ers of heaven therefore cried to You, O <u>Giv</u>er of Life: "Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Christ! <u>Glo</u>ry to Your <u>King</u>dom!// Glory to Your dispensation, O You who <u>love</u> mankind!"

Tone 4 – Patronal Troparion

Today the faithful celebrate the <u>feast</u> with joy, il<u>lum</u>ined by your coming, O <u>Mo</u>ther of God. Beholding your pure image we fervently <u>cry</u> to you: En<u>comp</u>ass us beneath the precious veil of your pro<u>tec</u>tion. Deliver us from every form of <u>e</u>vil by en<u>treat</u>ing Christ, your <u>Son</u> and our God// that He may <u>save</u> our souls.

Tone 8 – Troparion for St. Mary of Egypt

The image of <u>God</u> was <u>truly</u> preserved in you, O <u>Mother</u>, for you took <u>up</u> the <u>Cross</u> and <u>fol</u>lowed Christ. By so <u>doing</u>, you <u>taught</u> us to disre<u>gard</u> the flesh for it <u>pass</u>es away; but to care in<u>stead</u> for the <u>soul</u>, for it is im<u>mor</u>tal.// Therefore, your <u>spir</u>it, O <u>ho</u>ly Mother Mary, rejoices with the <u>ang</u>els.

Tone 1 – Resurrectional Kontakion As <u>God</u>, You rose from the tomb in <u>glo</u>ry, raising the <u>world</u> with Yourself. Human <u>na</u>ture praises You as God, for death has <u>van</u>ished. Adam exults, O <u>Mas</u>ter! Eve rejoices, for she is freed from bondage and <u>cries</u> to You:// "You are the Giver of Resurrection to <u>all</u>, O Christ!"

Tone 3 – Kontakion for St. Mary of Egypt

Having <u>been</u> a sinful <u>wo</u>man, you became through repentance a <u>bride</u> of Christ. Having attained ang<u>el</u>ic life, you defeated demons with the <u>weap</u>on of the Cross.// Therefore, O most glorious Mary, you are a <u>bride</u> of the <u>King</u>dom.

Tone 3 – Patronal Kontakion

Today the Virgin stands in the midst <u>of</u> the Church, And with choirs of saints she invisibly prays to <u>God</u> for us. Angels and bishops <u>wor</u>ship. Apostles and prophets rejoice to<u>ge</u>ther,// Since for our <u>sake</u> she <u>prays</u> to the eternal God.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Tone 1 – Sunday Prokeimenon (Psalm 32)

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us as we have set our hope on You!

Tone 4 – Prokeimenon for St. Mary (Psalm 67)

God is wonderful in His saints, / the God of Israel!

Epistle: Hebrews 9.11-14 (5th Sunday of Lent)

Brethren: Christ came as High Priest of the good things to come, with the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made with hands, that is, not of this creation. Not with the blood of goats and calves, but with His own blood He entered the Most Holy Place once for all, having obtained eternal redemption. For if the blood of bulls and goats and the ashes of a heifer, sprinkling the unclean, sanctifies for the purifying of the flesh, how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

Galatians 3.23-29 (St Mary of Egypt)

Brethren, before faith came, we were kept under guard by the law, kept for the faith which would afterward be revealed. Therefore, the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor. For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus. And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

Gospel: Mark 10.32-45 (5th Sunday)

At that time: they were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was going before them; and they were amazed. And as they followed, they were afraid. Then He took the twelve aside again and began to tell them the things that would happen to Him: "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and to the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and deliver Him to the Gentiles; and they will mock Him, and scourge Him, and spit on Him, and kill Him. And the third day He will rise again."

Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Him, saying, "Teacher, we want You to do for us whatever we ask."

And He said to them, "What do you want Me to do for you?"

They said to Him, "Grant us that we may sit, one on Your right hand and the other on Your left, in Your glory."

But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you ask. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They said to Him, "We are able."

So Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink the cup that I drink, and with the baptism I am baptized with you will be baptized; but to sit on My right hand and on My left is not Mine to give, but it is for those for whom it is prepared."

And when the ten heard it, they began to be greatly displeased with James and John. But Jesus called them to Himself and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. Yet it shall not be so among you; but whoever desires to become great among you shall be your servant. And whoever of you desires to be first shall be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Luke 7.36-50 (St Mary of Egypt)

At that time: One of the Pharisees asked Jesus to eat with him, and He went to the Pharisee's house, and sat down to eat. And behold, a woman in the city who was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at the table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of fragrant oil, and stood at His feet behind Him weeping; and she began to wash His feet with her tears, and wiped them with the hair of her head; and she kissed His feet and anointed them with the fragrant oil. Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw this, he spoke to himself, saying, "This Man, if He were a prophet, would know who and what manner of woman this is who is touching Him, for she is a sinner."

And Jesus answered and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." So he said, "Teacher, say it."

"There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. And when they had nothing with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?"

Simon answered and said, "I suppose the one whom he forgave more."

And He said to him, "You have rightly judged."

Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head. You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in. You did not anoint My head with oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil. Therefore, I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little."

Then He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven."

And those who sat at the table with Him began to say to themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?"

Then He said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you. Go in peace."
