

HYMNS OF THE DAY

Tone 1 – Resurrectional Troparion

When the <u>stone</u> had been sealed by the <u>Jews</u>, while the soldiers were guarding Your most pure <u>bo</u>dy, You <u>rose</u> on the third day, O <u>Sa</u>vior, granting <u>life</u> to the world.

The <u>pow</u>ers of heaven therefore cried to You, O <u>Giv</u>er of Life:

"Glory to Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Christ!

Glory to Your Kingdom!//

Glory to Your dispensation, O You who love mankind!"

Tone 4 – Patronal Troparion

Today the faithful celebrate the <u>feast</u> with joy, il<u>lum</u>ined by your coming, O <u>Mo</u>ther of God. Beholding your pure image we fervently <u>cry</u> to you: En<u>comp</u>ass us beneath the precious veil of your pro<u>tec</u>tion. Deliver us from every form of <u>e</u>vil by en<u>treating</u> Christ, your <u>Son</u> and our God// that He may <u>save</u> our souls.

Tone 8 – Troparion of the Holy Fathers

You are most <u>glo</u>rious, O <u>Christ</u> our God! You have es<u>tab</u>lished the <u>Ho</u>ly Fathers as <u>lights</u> on the earth. Through them You have <u>guid</u>ed us to the <u>true</u> Faith.// O greatly compassionate <u>One</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

Tone 1 - Resurrectional Kontakion

As <u>God</u>, You rose from the tomb in <u>glo</u>ry, raising the <u>world</u> with Yourself.
Human <u>na</u>ture praises You as God, for death has <u>van</u>ished.
Adam exults, O <u>Mas</u>ter!
Eve rejoices, for she is freed from bondage and <u>cries</u> to You://
"You are the Giver of Resurrection to <u>all</u>, O Christ!"

Tone 6 -Kontakion of the Holy Fathers

The Son Who shone forth from the <u>Fa</u>ther was ineffably born, two-fold in nature, of a <u>woman</u>. Having beheld Him, we do not deny the <u>image</u> of His form, but depict it piously and revere it <u>faithfully</u>. Thus, keeping the <u>True</u> Faith,// the Church venerates the icon of Christ In<u>car</u>nate.

Tone 3 - Patronal Kontakion

Today the Virgin stands in the midst <u>of</u> the Church, And with choirs of saints she invisibly prays to <u>God</u> for us. Angels and bishops <u>wor</u>ship. Apostles and prophets rejoice to<u>ge</u>ther,// Since for our <u>sake</u> she <u>prays</u> to the eternal God.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Tone 1 – Sunday Prokeimenon (Psalm 32)

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us / as we have set our hope on You!

Tone 4 – Prokeimenon of the Holy Fathers (Daniel 3)

Blessed are You, O Lord God of our fathers, and praised and glorified is Your Name forever!

Epistle: 2 Corinthians 9.6-11 (Sunday)

Brethren: This I say: "He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully." So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work. As it is written: "He has dispersed abroad, He has given to the poor; His righteousness endures forever."

Now may He who supplies seed to the sower, and bread for food, supply and multiply the seed you have sown and increase the fruits of your righteousness, while you are enriched in everything for all liberality, which causes thanksgiving through us to God.

Hebrews 13.7-16 (Holy Fathers)

Brethren: Remember those who rule over you, who have spoken the word of God to you, whose faith follow, considering the outcome of their conduct. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Do not be carried about with various and strange doctrines. For it is good that the heart be established by grace, not with foods which have not profited those who have been occupied with them.

We have an altar from which those who serve the tabernacle have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals, whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest for sin, are burned outside the camp. Therefore, Jesus also, that He might sanctify the people with His own blood, suffered outside the gate. Therefore, let us go forth to Him, outside the camp, bearing His reproach. For here we have no continuing city, but we seek the one to come. Therefore, by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name. But do not forget to do good and to share, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.

Gospel: Luke 7.11-16 (Sunday)

At that time, it happened that Jesus went into a city called Nain; and many of His disciples went with Him, and a large crowd. And when He came near the gate of the city, behold, a dead man was being carried out, the only son of his mother; and she was a widow. And a large crowd from the city was with her. When the Lord saw her, He had compassion on her and said to her, "Do not weep." Then He came and touched the open coffin, and those who carried him stood still. And He said, "Young man, I say to you, arise."

So, he who was dead sat up and began to speak. And He presented him to his mother. Then fear came upon all, and they glorified God, saying, "A great prophet has risen up among us"; and, "God has visited His people."

John 17.1-13 (Holy Fathers)

Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: "Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You, as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him. And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent.

"I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do. And now, O Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was. I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word. Now they have known that all things which You have given Me are from You.

For I have given to them the words which You have given Me; and they have received them, and have known surely that I came forth from You; and they have believed that You sent Me. I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those whom You have given Me, for they are Yours. And all Mine are Yours, and Yours are Mine, and I am glorified in them.

Now I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep through Your name those whom You have given Me, that they may be one as We are. While I was with them in the world, I kept them in Your name. Those whom You gave Me I have kept; and none of them is lost except the son of perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I come to You, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have My joy fulfilled in themselves.

Archpastoral Decree

Of His Eminence, our Archbishop Daniel

O people, let us hasten to the Virgin Theotokos and Queen, giving thanks to Christ our God,
And looking upon her miraculous image with contrition, let us fall down and cry out to her:
O Mary, our Sovereign Lady, who visit this land

in the miraculous appearance of thy precious image, save all the Christians in peace and prosperity, showing us as heirs of the heavenly life.

For to thee do we cry out with faith:

Rejoice, O Virgin, the salvation of the world!

(Kontakion, Tone 8)

WHEREAS in the Gospel of Saint Luke, we read of the visitation of the Virgin Mary to her kinswoman Elizabeth immediately after the Annunciation, where Elizabeth greets her with the words: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! But why is this granted to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Luke 1:42-43); and

WHEREAS our Lord Jesus Christ entrusted His Church to the maternal care of His own Mother when, upon the Cross, He spoke to His Beloved Disciple and Apostle John, saying: "Behold your Mother" (John 19:27); and

WHEREAS the Holy Church has always sought the prayers and intercessions of the Mother of its Lord, honored Her as "Blessed Among Women" and venerated her in the Holy Icons; and

WHEREAS the Icon of the Mother of God, the One Who Shows the Way, *of Tikhvin* has been venerated by the faithful throughout the centuries of its recorded history, first in Jerusalem, then in Constantinople, Tikhvin, Riga, the war-torn countries of Europe, and Chicago and the Midwest; and

WHEREAS this venerable and wonderworking Icon was preserved and protected by the ever-memorable Archbishop John of Chicago and the Midwest, and then by his family, most notably the ever-memorable servants of God, Archpriest Sergei and Matushka Alexandra Garklavs, inviting special veneration at Saint Panteleimon Church in Summit Argo, Illinois, at the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity in Chicago, Illinois, and throughout the Diocese of the Midwest; and

WHEREAS in July 2004, after almost five decades in America, the Icon was returned to its Shrine within the Monastery of the Holy Dormition in Tikhvin, Russia; and

WHEREAS an Icon of the Mother of God of Tikhvin, made as a true copy and then blessed upon the original in the Tikhvin Monastery Church, was presented to Holy Trinity Cathedral and the Diocese of the Midwest by His Grace Bishop Mstislav of Tikhvin during the Archpastoral Ministry of the ever-memorable Archbishop Paul; and

WHEREAS this Icon has been enshrined within the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity, the Mother Church and Diocesan Cathedral of the Diocese of the Midwest, resulting in an increasing knowledge and veneration to the Mother of God invoked in Her Tikhvin Icon; and

WHEREAS the God-protected Diocese of Chicago and the Midwest continues to be blessed through the presence of the Icon and invites the diocesan Clergy and Faithful and others to prayerfully turn to the Most Pure Mother of God and Ever-Virgin Mary, seeking her prayers and protection, asking her help in times of need and glorifying the All-Holy Trinity and recalling Her own words "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior" (Luke 1:46-47); and

WHEREAS the Holy Church continues to turn to the Mother of God invoked in Her wonderworking and miraculous Icon, a source of heavenly blessing and graces; and

WHEREAS this love and devotion to the Mother of God *of Tikhvin* is to be cultivated and promoted throughout the Diocese of the Midwest, in its parish and mission communities, and in the hearts of all the Faithful People of God:

I HEREBY PROCLAIM that the Mother of God *of Tikhvin* is to be honored and venerated as the Sovereign Lady, Queen, and Protectress of the Clergy and Faithful of this God-protected Diocese of Chicago and the Midwest.

Given on this fourth day of October in the Year of Our Lord 2023, in the presence of the Clergy and Faithful gathered in solemn assembly in the Church of Saint Peter and Saint Paul Paul, Burr Ridge, Illinois.

May our Most Pure, Most Blessed, and Glorious Lady, the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary, our Mother and Queen, invoked in her Holy Icon *of Tikhvin,* ever intercede for us before the Throne of Her Son, our Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ, to Whom be glory now and forever. Amen.
