

## March 3, 2024 Sunday of the Prodigal Son

The Sunday after the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee is the Sunday of the Prodigal Son. This parable of God's forgiveness calls us to "come to ourselves" as did the prodigal son, to see ourselves as being "in a far country" far from the Father's house, and to make the journey of return to God. We are given every assurance by the Master that our heavenly Father will receive us with joy and gladness. We must only "arise and go," confessing our self-inflicted and sinful separation from that "home" where we truly belong (Luke 15:11-24).

Starting tomorrow, the weekday readings summarize the events of Holy Week. On Monday we read Saint Mark's account of the Entry into Jerusalem. On Tuesday we read how Judas went to the chief priests and offered to betray the Lord. On the night before

His death Christ tells His disciples that one of them will betray Him. He also predicts that they will desert Him, and that Peter will deny Him three times. On Wednesday the Gospel describes how Judas betrayed the Savior with a kiss. Thursday's Gospel tells how Jesus was questioned by Pilate. On Friday we read the narrative of Christ's crucifixion and death.

#### HYMNS OF THE DAY

#### Tone 6 - Resurrectional Troparion

The angelic <u>pow</u>ers were at Your tomb; the guards became as <u>dead</u> men.

Mary <u>stood</u> by Your grave, seeking Your most pure <u>body</u>.

You <u>cap</u>tured hell, not being <u>tempt</u>ed by it.

You came to the Virgin <u>granting life.//</u>
O Lord, Who rose from the dead, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

#### Tone 4 - Patronal Troparion

Today the faithful celebrate the <u>feast</u> with joy, il<u>lum</u>ined by your coming, O <u>Mo</u>ther of God.

Beholding your pure image we fervently <u>cry</u> to you:

En<u>comp</u>ass us beneath the precious veil of your pro<u>tection</u>.

Deliver us from every form of <u>e</u>vil by en<u>treating</u> Christ, your <u>Son</u> and our God// that He may <u>save</u> our souls.

#### Tone 6 - Resurrectional Kontakion

When Christ God the <u>Giv</u>er of Life, raised all of the <u>dead</u> from the valleys of misery with His <u>migh</u>ty hand, He bestowed resurrection on the <u>hu</u>man race.//
He is the Savior of all, the Resurrection, the Life, and the <u>God</u> of all.

#### Tone 3 - Kontakion for the Prodigal Son

I have <u>reck</u>lessly forgotten Your glory, O <u>Fa</u>ther; and among sinners I have scattered the riches which You <u>gave</u> me. And now I cry to You as the <u>Prod</u>igal: "I have sinned before You, O merciful <u>Fa</u>ther; receive me as a <u>pen</u>itent, // and make me as <u>one</u> of Your <u>hired ser</u>vants!"

#### Tone 3 - Patronal Kontakion

Today the Virgin stands in the midst <u>of</u> the Church, And with choirs of saints she invisibly prays to <u>God</u> for us. Angels and bishops <u>wor</u>ship. Apostles and prophets rejoice to<u>ge</u>ther,// Since for our <u>sake</u> she <u>prays</u> to the eternal God.

#### **SCRIPTURE READINGS**

#### Tone 6 – Resurrectional Prokeimenon (Psalm 11)

O Lord, save Your people, / and bless Your inheritance!

#### **Epistle: 1 Corinthians 6.12-20**

Brethren: All things are lawful for me, but all things are not helpful. All things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any. Foods for the stomach and the stomach for foods, but God will destroy both it and them. Now the body is not for sexual immorality but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God both raised up the Lord and will also raise us up by His power.

Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a harlot? Certainly not! Or do you not know that he who is joined to a harlot is one body with her? For "the two," He says, "shall become one flesh." But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with Him. Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body. Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore, glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's.

#### Gospel: Luke 15.11-32

Jesus spoke this parable to His disciples: "A certain man had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the portion of goods that falls to me.' So he divided to them his livelihood. And not many days after, the younger son gathered all together, journeyed to a far country, and there wasted his possessions with prodigal living.

"But when he had spent all, there arose a severe famine in that land, and he began to be in want. Then he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country, and he sent him into his fields to feed

swine. And he would gladly have filled his stomach with the pods that the swine ate, and no one gave him anything.

"But when he came to himself, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you, and I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Make me like one of your hired servants."

"And he arose and came to his father. But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him. And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight, and am no longer worthy to be called your son.'

"But the father said to his servants, 'Bring out the best robe and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand and sandals on his feet. And bring the fatted calf here and kill it, and let us eat and be merry; for this my son was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' And they began to be merry.

"Now his older son was in the field. And as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. So he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. And he said to him, 'Your brother has come, and because he has received him safe and sound, your father has killed the fatted calf.' But he was angry and would not go in.

"Therefore, his father came out and pleaded with him. So he answered and said to his father, 'Lo, these many years I have been serving you; I never transgressed your commandment at any time; and yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might make merry with my friends. But as soon as this son of yours came, who has devoured your livelihood with harlots, you killed the fatted calf for him.'

"And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that I have is yours. It was right that we should make merry and be glad, for your brother was dead and is alive again, and was lost and is found."

A new class for catechumens will start Saturday, March 16. Class will be held once a month before Great Vespers, beginning at 4:30pm. Catechumens should make every effort to attend. However, the class is open to anyone interested in the basics of Orthodox Christianity. The next class will be on April 20.

Every year, Orthodox Christian homes are blessed with the new holy water of Theophany. Make an appointment with Fr Jacob to have your home blessed. The Church teaches us to sanctify everything: dwellings, places of work, all our pursuits, and the fruits of our labor. The home blessing at Theophany represents a renewal of our lives in Christ.

Here is how to prepare for your house blessing: All who reside in the household should make every effort to be present for the blessing. We gather in the dining room or home altar. On your dining room table or family icon corner, set 1) A lit candle, 2) An icon of Christ, and 3) A small bowl. You may also prepare a list of the names of family members living and departed you wish to pray for. Also please remember to turn off any televisions or other noisy electronics. When the priest arrives everyone in the house should gather around the table/family altar and join in prayer and singing. If there are children, they usually carry the icon and a candle to lead the priest from room to room. If not, any member of the household will lead the priest. After the blessing, we gather back around the icon to commemorate family names and for the dismissal.
